

The MCSC 2007 EXPO Exhibit Judges have been announced. They are as follows:

Mr. Tim Bartshe, Golden Colorado.

A collector for over 50 years, Mr. Bartshe specializes in the Boer Republics, notably Orange Free State (Orange River Colony) and the South African Republic (Transvaal). He has been exhibiting these two areas since 1997 and has been an APS accredited judge since 1999. Many other areas of collecting are also of interest ranging from FDC's of South African issues to the thematic subject of trout. Presently he is Secretary of the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors. Philatelic exhibitions from locals to nationals are of a primary interest to him especially promoting the "art" of exhibiting.

Mr. Jay Stotts, Houston, Texas:

Mr. Stotts was accredited as an APS national judge in 1989 and is currently accredited as a national Chief Judge. He served as the president of the Bureau Issues Association (1993-97) and the United States Stamp Society (2000-03) and is currently on their Board of Governors. He is also a Board member of the Texas Philatelic Association and the Southwest Philatelic Foundation. He was awarded the TPA's Distinguished Philatelic Texan Award in 1999 and the USSS' Hopkinson Award for both writing and exhibiting. He has won APS WSP national Gold Medals with Traditional, Postal History, Aerophilately and First Day Cover exhibits and is a four-time National Grand Award winner. He specializes in 20th Century United States material.

Dr. Paul E. Tyler Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Dr. Tyler has been an APS Accredited Judge since 1991 and has served on the juries of numerous stamp shows since then. He has served as the President and awards chairman (1991-1994) of the Society of American Specialists/Oceana, Treasurer of the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors, Secretary and journal editor of the New Mexico Philatelic Association, Award Chairperson of the American Philatelic Congress, executive director of the American Topical Association, editor of the Washington, D.C. Philatelic Society newsletter (1989-1991) and director of the American Philatelic Society (1993-1997). He is also a member of the Royal Philatelic Society (London), Royal Philatelic Society, (New Zealand), Christ Church Philatelic Society (New Zealand) and Wellington Philatelic Society (New Zealand). His specialties are Literature, New Zealand, Traditional, Single Frame and Display Class exhibits.
