2019 Postage Rate Changes

January 2019

The USPS was recently granted approval for the new postage rates that they had requested. A chart showing the most commonly used rates is shown to the left.

First class rates have a whopping 10% increase, on the other hand, the "additional ounce" and "non-machinable surcharges" have a 28% decrease!

All other domestic postage rates seem to have various increases, which the exception of postcards which stay at 35¢.

International Mail has the base rate (and nonmachinable surcharge) stay the same at \$1.15, but all other international rates are also seeing increases.

You can save 5¢ on regular first class mail if you are using metered mail or certain other forms of postage such as customized/personalized postage and internet postage (such as "Netstamps" from Stamps.com).

I've never really understood why regular 1st Class postage stops at 3.5 ounces, but it's probably because that is equivalent to 100 grams. Why that matters for domestic mail in the USA which is not on the metric system, I can't figure out...

The new rates will take effect on Sunday, January 27, 2019. The "price list" for postage rates is known as "Notice 123" and can be found at: https://pe.usps.com/text/ dmm300/notice123.htm . At this time it shows the rates in effect as of January 21, 2018 and will be updated after the rate changes.

Editor's Forum



Of course, it is a semipostal stamp and perhaps many people don't want to pay "extra" for that. An earlier regular (nonsemi-postal) version of this design was issued a few years ago with the same image, but facing left instead of right.

Perhaps one of the reasons for lack of sales is that US Post Office clerks really don't do a great job in pushing any sort of commemorative stamp; they'd rather just sell a booklet of flag stamps than showing customers the various commemorative and special stamps that are available.

Sadly for me, this stamp kind of hits home... like so many people, I have parents with this terrible disease, but I have bought a couple of sheets and do use them as postage!



How To Use A Santa Souvenir Sheet for Postage

The 2018 Christmas stamps were a booklet pane of 4 Santa stamps, and also a 50ϕ souvenir sheet based on one of those 4 design.

Unfortunately, they were only available by mail order.

But, since they are only a single stamp sheet, they are perfect for

using as postage for Christmas cards.

The trick though is peeling them off the backing paper, which is easy if you want to use just the stamp part, not so easy if you're trying to remove the entire sheet from the backing paper. Fiddling with a corner for several minutes results in what you see below:

So, how does one remove the backing paper without damaging the sheet? Simple: A sharp Xacto knife! I simply "scored" the back of the sheet across one of the corners, then was able to "crack" the backing paper, allowing me to easily remove the short corner, followed by carefully peeling the remainder off and then placing the sheet on an envelope (if done right, the die-cut stamp will stay put inside the sheet!).


Arlington Meeting Minutes December 5, 2018
