Been There, Done That

REPUBLIKA HRVATSKA



In the late 1980's, Croatia and Slovenia, two of Yugoslavia's federal republics, sought political reforms that would transfer Yugoslavia into a union of independent states.

The Serbian leader, Slobodan Milošević, opposed the breakup of Yugoslavia. Croatia and Slovenia declared their independence in June of 1991. Immediately war broke out. Serbs living in Croatia fought against

the Croatian government with help from the Yugoslavian army. Within a short time, Croatia lost 30% of its territory. 40% of its industry was destroyed.

A ceasefire was agreed to in early 1992 between Croatia, the Serbians and the Montenegrins who fought alongside the Serbs. In April 1992, the two remaining federal republics, Serbia and Montenegro, formed a new Yugoslavian state, which recognized Croatian independence.

In 1995, Croatia began taking back territory lost in the war. In late 1995, the Croatian government and the Serbs living in Croatia made peace. And finally, in 1998, the remaining territory lost during the war was returned to Croatia.

During the brief war, over 10,000 people were killed, many of them civilians.

On our trip to the Balkans in December 2017, Pat and I visited the war memorial and the war museum in Dubrovnik. The memorial is located on top of the hill overlooking the city. The picture above shows the memorial dedicated to those that were killed; the picture below was taken inside the war museum and shows photos of some of these killed in the war, as well as a Croatian flag.





The stamp shown at left is Croatia Scott #104 that was issued on January 15, 1992 while the war was being fought and features the Croatian coat of arms.

## Editor's Forum

EXPO 2019 is just around the corner (approximately 2 or 3 weeks after this newsletter is published)! If you're still working on finishing your exhibits (as I'm doing at this time...), you may want to brush up on the APS guidelines for philatelic exhibits. Unlike many years ago, the APS Judging Manual is now free of charge! It's simply a PDF file that you can download from the APS Website at:

https://stamps.org/Events/Judging-Information

I was told by one of our readers (but not member), that the link in the PDF files isn't properly clickable and it may not go to the exact site. In this case it was a link to a specific Wikipedia article, but it wrapped across 2 lines in the article column.

After investigating this, I found out that Microsoft Publisher (in which I create this newsletter) DOES properly create a link even if the link spans more than one line (which happens as many website links can be really long!), but when I turn the Publisher document into an Adobe Acrobat PDF file, that link is now "truncated" to each line. So, if the link <u>https:// en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Philately</u> is written this way, it probably won't work, but if I keep it to one line, such as this: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Philately, it will work.

What if the link is over 2 lines to begin with, such as h t t p s : // e n . w i k i p e d i a . o r g / w i k i / Philatelic\_literature#Stamp\_catalogues , then it won't work either, but I can simply say <u>click here</u> for a link to a Wikipedia page about stamp catalogs. Now, that "click here" link in the previous sentence works fine if you're reading the PDF file of the newsletter and you simply "click here", however, in a printed version, you have no clue as to what that actual webpage behind "click here" actually is!

## <u>Errata</u>

In the October issue, my article about the "Goldenes Dachl" contained a link to the Wikipedia page on the same subject, however, the link in the PDF file only took you to Wikipedia itself, not the Goldenes Dachl page. While the link was correct and worked properly in my Microsoft Publisher document, once it was turned into a PDF file, Acrobat "broke" the link (since it was spread over two lines in the article)

## **Buffalo or Bison?** Yummy in either case!

In the May 2017 issue of Stamping Around I wrote about "Beef -It's What's For Dinner", but really wrote about eating buffalo (aka "bison") meat, and that it is better for you than regular "beef" (i.e.: cows, bulls & oxen) because of it being: 1) lower in cholesterol, 2) lower in fat, 3) higher in protein and a good source of Omega-3 fats (the "good fats").

To illustrate bison, I had shown USA #1392 (6¢ issue from 1970) and #3468 (21¢ definitive from 2001). But I had forgotten about the "Western Wildlife" stamp from the "Legends of the West" issue from 1994, Scott #2869p, which also featured a bison and is shown above to the left.

Now, how does all of this factor into this "Been There - Done That" article? Well, it started in July 1995, when I was on a road trip to Canada, which started with an Infinity O45 rental car; what better way to see Idaho, with it's unlimited highway speed limit at that time. Oh, whom am I kidding! Idaho was kind of a blur because the lack of freeway speed limits!

We then crossed into Montana, and I do remember driving through Glacier National Park via Kalispell. It's a very beautiful scenic drive and we did stop off to walk around on some snow at Marias Pass. Then we continued north to Calgary, in Alberta, Canada. From there it was on to Banff and Lake Louise.



In the photo above, you can see the city of Lake Louise where we stayed in (what is now) the Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise on the shores of Lake Louise, which is what the arrow is pointing to.

During our visit, we took one of the aerial cable lifts from the Lake Louise Ski Resort up to the top and walked around a bit. Since it was lunch time, we stopped at (what I

remember to be a snack bar - looking it up on Google Maps just now, appears to be called Temple Lodge - and I had my first ever "buffalo burger" ! Ever since then, I try to have buffalo (or bison) burgers when possible!

I couldn't find a Canadian stamp featuring Lake Louise, but did find at Stampboards.com a 1930's promotional label (see link below).

This Funky Winkerbean comic strip appeared on June 22, 2019 in the Dallas Morning News and was part of a multiday series. In the October 2019 issue, I showed the previous day's (June 21) comic strip, where the postal clerk thanked the character for buying some particular stamps, that apparently the clerk was happy to "unload". The next day, we find out what those stamps were, which is apparently the Batman stamps from 2014 (which are either Scott #4928-4931 or #4932-4935 depending which die-cut type they are).

Were these stamps really as unpopular as the comment from the June 21 alluded to? Hard to say. On the other hand, the SSK machine Spiderman stamps weren't really popular with the postage consuming public either (and I know that as a fact from supervisors that told me that during the 2-month period in May-June 2014, that they sold less postage from the SSK machines than when basic flag design stamps were in stalled)! So, does this mean that "Super Hero" stamps are not that popular with the "general public"? Hard to say. Maybe comic book collectors might like them, but then probably mostly as a collectible, and not so much for postage use. In this case, the comic strip character himself is a comic illustrator in the Funky Winkerbean series (from what I remember).

14 members & guests gathered at the Bentwater Activities Center, 1800 W. Emerald Bend Court, in Granbury, for the Lake Granbury Branch, Mid-Cities Stamp Club auction.

## Comic Strip - Blondie (Dog Phobia)

This September 17, 2019 "Blondie" comic strip makes fun of mailmen getting bit by dogs. Based on some "googling", a USPS website (see this link: dog attacks) states that the number of postal employees that were attacked by dogs fell to only 5,714 in 2018, which was about 500 less than in 2017 and more than 1,000 less than in 2016 due to various safety initiatives and tips for pet owners. Supposedly, the mobile scanners for delivery confirmation include a feature to indicate a presence of a dog at that address.

The worst ranking city of dog attacks in 2018: Houston with18 attacks, Dallas is at #5 with 49 attacks; San Antonio is #6 and Ft. Worth is #10.
